Unit 20 -Tourism Society and Culture (THM3001)

Competences: – at the end of the module/unit the learner will have acquired the responsibility and autonomy to:

- a) Understand the significance and role of tourism in post-modern society.
- b) Identify the positive and negative social impacts that tourism development can have on culture.
- c) Understand the attraction of the 'primitive order' within the international tourist system.
- d) Comprehend the complexity of trying to influence and control host-guest interactions and understand the variable factors that influence the degree of impact of these interactions.
- e) Understand how destination imagery can be a key component in determining the success of tourism.
- f) Interpret how political control of tourism development influences its social impacts and how it may be interpreted as another form of neo-colonialism.
- g) Understand the complexity of employment issues in the tourism industry and the problems of sex tourism.
- h) Understand the social implications of placing cultures into the global tourism system as a form of commodity.

- a) All the variants that determine the social impacts of tourism developments.
- b) History of tourism and its impact on culture.
- c) Anthropology and sociology and their relevance to tourism.
- d) Social hierarchies and resort development; political aspects of tourism development and tourism as a form of neo-colonialism.
